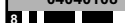
УПАТСТВО ЗА КАНДИДАТОТ

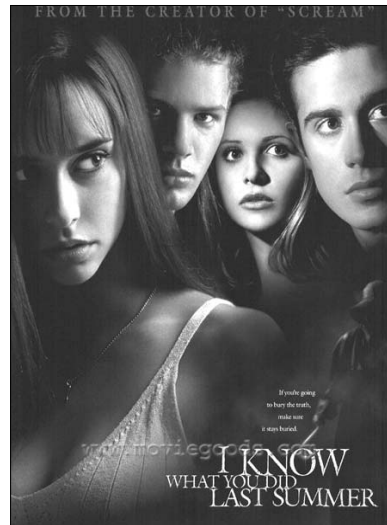
Question:

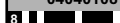

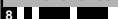
